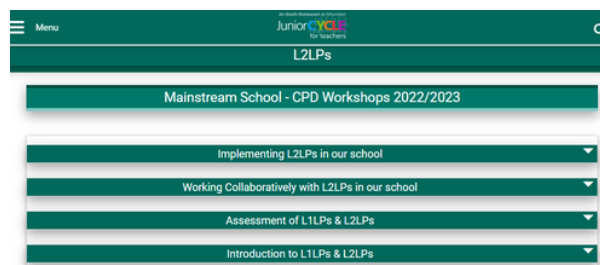

This workshop is suitable for teachers of all subject disciplines but may be of particular interest to teachers of students with English as an Additional Language (EAL) and teachers of L1LPs/L2LPs.

During this workshop participants will:

- explore the world of zine-making
- consider the use of zines in the classroom as multi-modal texts
- take inspiration from the exhibits of the museum to explore a range of approaches to zine-making
- collaborate with other participants to enhance and enrich the workshop experience

*A zine is a small scale, self-published work, similar to a magazine, which can focus on a variety of topics. It can contain writing and/or images and can also be a digital publication offering opportunities for audio and visual content.

Priority Learning Units

The L1LPs and L2LPs build on prior learning but are essentially designed around Priority Learning Units (PLUs) that focus on the social, personal and pre-vocational skills that prepare students for further study and life. There are 5 PLUs at Level 2; Communication & Literacy, Numeracy, Living in the Community, Personal Care and Preparing for Work. There are 6 PLUs at Level 1; Communication, Language & Literacy, Numeracy, Personal Care & Wellbeing, Being part of a Community, The Arts and Physical Education.

Each priority learning unit is a cross curricular unit of learning. To ensure students are engaging with a broad and balanced curriculum, they should engage with all 5 PLUs at Level 2 and 6 PLUs at Level 1. Dependent on the identified individual strengths and needs of each student, they should engage with the PLUs through as many Junior Cycle subjects as possible.

It is a free website with a range of maths activities for all levels of mathematical ability. There are worksheets covering a range of maths topics and seasonally themed worksheets such as these St. Patrick's Day worksheets.
