In session 1 we worked on developing clarity around the expectations of the learning outcomes, both for classroom practice and for assessment, through consideration of the action verb. An action verb poster was



distributed to teachers and can be found <u>here</u>, along with some other documents you can use when working with LOs.

In session 2 and 3 we explored a developmental approach to both of the Classroom-Based Assessments, studying the essential features of the Extended Experimental Investigation (EEI) and the Science in Society Investigation (SSI).

ICT Corner

Now that you have checked out our "starter" Padlet for E&S6, you and your colleagues might like to edit it and add to it. Here's how:

1. Set up a free <u>Padlet</u> account.

2 Follow the <u>link</u> to our Padlet and then click "remake" in the top right hand corner

3. Select 'Share' in the top right corner. Change the privacy settings so that your colleagues can all edit the wall. Then email the URL to your colleagues.

4. Both you and your colleagues are now free to add to the wall of your Padlet even if they don't have an account. (Only 1 member of the department needs to have a Padlet account.) Works great on phones too!
